The book for April will be Norwegian by Night by Derek B. Miller. "Miller's affecting debut, about a cantankerous Jewish widower transplanted to Norway who becomes party to a hate crime, is an unusual hybrid: part memory novel, part police procedural, part sociopolitical tract and part existential meditation." Kirkus "Truly a page-turner...Norwegian by Night is about past wars and present-day ethnic strife, family, grief, guilt and, ultimately, redemption. Korea (and phantom Koreans), Vietnam, the Holocaust, ethnic identity — Serb, Norwegian, Muslim, and yes, Jewish, these are the true characters of the novel.Funny, moving and thoroughly gripping." The book for May will be Quicksand by Nella Larsen. "Nella Larsen's novels Quicksand (1928) and Passing (1929) document the historical realities of Harlem in the 1920s and shed a bright light on the social world of the black bourgeoisie. The novel's greatest appeal and achievement, however, is not sociological, but psychological. . . . Larsen takes the theme of psychic dualism, so popular in Harlem Renaissance fiction, to a higher and more complex level, displaying a sophisticated understanding and penetrating analysis of black female psychology" (back cover).

**Film Group: .Saturday April 24 at 1:30 p.m.** via Zoom. We are continuing with <u>Great Directors Great Films</u>. Our film will be <u>Gentlemen's Agreement</u>, filmed in 1947. Directed by Elia Kazan, and starring Gregory Peck, it is the story of a highly respected writer who decides to write a series of articles about Anti Semitism in America, by pretending he is Jewish.
